SPARKLING

Sparkling wine, in all its forms, has become one of the most dynamic categories in the wine world—cherished from the hills of Franciacorta in Italy to the cellars of Cava in Spain, from Tasmania’s cool-climate vineyards to California’s innovative producers. Yet at the very heart of this global story lies France’s most iconic sparkling wine region—Champagne—long synonymous with celebration and luxury. Traditionally dominated by the grandes marques, or large Champagne houses, the region is now experiencing a renaissance. Independent grower-producers, once suppliers of grapes to the big names, are increasingly choosing to craft their own terroir-driven Champagnes. This movement, known as Grower Champagne, brings new vitality to the region, blending centuries-old traditions with modern creativity, and offering wine lovers a more intimate and authentic taste of place within the broader sparkling wine universe.

RÉCOLTANT MANIPULANT: GROWER CHAMPAGNES

Montagne de Reims – Paleogene & Cretaceous

The Montagne de Reims, a broad chalk plateau stretching between Reims and Épernay, is one of Champagne's most celebrated terroirs. Its foundation rests on Upper Cretaceous chalk layers—the older Belemnite chalk overlain by the finer Micraster chalk—topped with varying soils of clay, sand, and marl depending on slope and valley. This geology creates a natural divide between the Grande Montagne de Reims, where thin chalky soils on steep slopes produce powerful, structured Pinot Noir (notably from Grand Cru villages such as Verzenay, Bouzy, and Ambonnay), and the Vallées de l'Ardre and Vesle, where mixed soils of chalk, clay, and sand favor Pinot Meunier, giving softer, fruit-driven wines. Together, these sub-regions showcase the dual character of Montagne de Reims: structure and minerality from chalk, complemented by supple fruit from the valleys.

Vallée de la Marne – Paleogene

The Vallée de la Marne stretches westward from Épernay along the river Marne, forming one of Champagne’s most diverse and extensive viticultural areas. Unlike the Montagne de Reims and Côte des Blancs, which are dominated by pure Cretaceous chalk, the Vallée de la Marne is underlain in large part by younger Paleogene (Tertiary) deposits.

Côte des Blancs – Cretaceous

The Côte des Blancs is Champagne’s archetypal expression of Cretaceous chalk terroir, a narrow strip of vineyard land running south from Épernay that has become synonymous with Chardonnay of the highest

pedigree. Here, the soils are exceptionally thin, often little more than a dusting of topsoil over deep, pure Upper Cretaceous chalk. This chalk, formed millions of years ago from compacted marine sediments, acts as both a reservoir and a filter — storing winter rainfall and releasing it gradually through summer while forcing vine roots to dig deep in search of water and nutrients. The result is a unique growing environment that amplifies Chardonnay's tension, purity, and mineral expression, producing wines of crystalline acidity, striking finesse, and remarkable longevity.

Montgueux – Cretaceous Turonian

*Both Montgueux and the Côte des Blancs are Chardonnay on Cretaceous chalk, but different chalk ages (Turonian vs Campanian/Maastrichtian) and climates shape their wines. Montgueux offers riper, broader, exotic Chardonnay with mineral cut, while Côte des Blancs delivers the reference style: pure, linear, and age-worthy blanc de blancs, earning it the title “**Montrachet of Champagne**.”*

Côte des Bar – Jurassic Kimmeridgian

The Côte des Bar rests on Jurassic Kimmeridgian limestone, a terroir it shares with nearby Chablis rather than the chalk heartlands around Épernay. Here, fossil-rich marl and clay-limestone soils, combined with a warmer, more southerly climate, produce Champagnes with a distinctive Burgundian sensibility. Pinot Noir dominates the landscape, thriving in the heavier soils to yield wines with generosity, ripe fruit, and supple texture — a contrast to the taut, mineral edge of chalk-driven Champagne.

Within the Côte des Bar, three sub-regions reveal subtle differences:

- **Bar-sur-Aubois:** A slightly cooler zone with higher altitudes, where Pinot Noir retains more freshness and lifted aromatics.
- **Bar-Sequanais:** A warmer sector with clay-rich slopes that give rounder, fuller-bodied Champagnes, often marked by red fruit and spice.
- **Les Riceys:** Unique in Champagne, this cluster of villages is famed not only for sparkling wines but also for its still Rosé des Riceys, a Pinot Noir rosé prized for its depth, savoury complexity, and longevity — an echo of the region's Burgundian kinship.

Together, these sub-regions show the diversity of the Côte des Bar: from fresher highland Pinot to generous valley wines and the singular expression of Rosé des Riceys. What unites them is the Jurassic Kimmeridgian bedrock, anchoring the Côte des Bar as Champagne's southern outpost with a style that blends Champagne's sparkle with Burgundy's soul.

Coteaux Champenois

The Coteaux Champenois AOC is Champagne’s still wine appellation, a reminder that long before sparkling wine defined the region, these chalky slopes were prized for their quiet expressions of Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, and Pinot Meunier. Covering the same delimited area as Champagne, the AOC permits the production of red, white, and rosé still wines, though volumes are small and styles vary with terroir. From the chalk-dominated Côte des Blancs and Montagne de Reims, which yield chiselled, mineral-driven whites, to the Pinot-focused slopes of the Vallée de la Marne and the Côte des Bar, where Kimmeridgian soils lend Burgundian depth to reds, Coteaux Champenois captures a different side of Champagne’s geology. Often rare and site-specific, these wines offer both historical authenticity and terroir transparency — the essence of Champagne without the bubbles.
